Community Challenges

We are proud to call Milo-Grogan our home. However, as neighbors coming together, we acknowledge that our community faces some unique challenges that need to be addressed.

On-Going Development: As developmental pressures increase in and around Milo-Grogan, we are at risk of change happening to us, instead of with us. Neighborhood Civic groups have voiced concerns about growing socioeconomic gaps.

Health & Nutrition: There is a lack of grocery stores, green spaces, parks, and garden space in Milo-Grogan. 33% of Milo-Grogan households experience food insecurity (perceived access to healthy foods), which is

directly linked to higher BMI and chronic disease, like heart disease, stroke, cancers, and COVID-19.

Economic Disparity: 45% of Milo-Grogan residents live below the poverty level, with the per capita income level being \$11,636 (154% lower than Franklin County's per capita income). There are little to no social enterprises in Milo-Grogan that build into the local economy, build community pride, and provide vocational engagement.

Our Solutions: A Community Resource

Know Neighbors

We believe in knowing our neighbors and being the best neighbor possible. Authentic relationships are what makes Milo-Grogan so beautiful and so strong.

Foster Local Leadership

We believe that building into leaders on-the-ground is key to addressing root causes of broken systems and economic disparities among neighborhoods. The voices of residents need to be organized, united, and heard.

Ensure Vibrancy for All

We believe that vibrant neighborhoods have an abundance of green spaces, gardens, parks, and access to fresh, nutritional food.

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Civic Engagement Events: In 2020, we organized 46 events and workshops that were led by and with neighbors. Although COVID-19 presented us with some real challenges when it came to gathering people together, all of the events were COVID-safe and educational. Examples include Sewing Classes with Cat Mailloux, Flower Arrangement Workshops, Green Space Work Days, and Gardening Classes for Kids. Attendance at these civic engagement activities totaled over 500 attendees, both participants and volunteers.

Newsletters: The Milo-Grogan Civic Association Newsletters was compiled each month by the Executive Director and volunteers (special thanks to volunteers, Courtney St. Onge and Catherine Elliot) and distributed

door-to-door to 650 Milo households each month. We have 14 neighbors committed to distributing the newsletter to their street. This year, we were able to expand the newsletter to include a monthly biographical spotlight on a neighbor.

Emergency Assistance: We expanded our Emergency Assistance program this year because of the crises that COVID-19 created. We distributed \$11,000 dollars of care to 28 Milo-Grogan households, this included numerous runs to the grocery stores for senior citizens during Ohio's Shelter in Place order. Our hope is to maintain connection with each of these households.



Foster Local Leadership

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Although COVID-19 stopped us from launching our newest leadership development program (Civic Leadership Training), we were still able to strategically invest in Milo-Grogan residents & leaders.

The Rooted House is operating in full-swing with four women interning for the year. The residents have invested over 1,000 of volunteer hours into neighborhood initiatives and committed to routine leadership development training.

Civic Association Support: Although COVID-19 has prevented the Civic Association from gathering in person, we provided 20 Milo-Grogan households with Litter Pick Up Kits and continued to distribute the monthly newsletter. During our Shelter in Place order, the newsletter was the only communication some neighbors had with the broader neighborhood. We remain the Civic Association's fiscal sponsor for funding opportunities.

Neighbor-led Initiatives: This year brought a renewed focus on supporting initiatives that are specifically led by neighbors. We gave \$1,065 in small grants to organizations and individuals who are doing great things in Milo-Grogan, like Cat Mailloux's Sewing Classes, The Brown Foundation Community Center, the Milo-Grogan Recreation Center, and various educational workshops.



Ensure a Vibrant Neighborhood for All we believe that vibrant neighborhoods have an abundance of green spaces, gardens, parks, and access to fresh, nutritional food.

Milo-Grogan Green Space: In 2020, we hosted 31 work days in the Green Space with typically 10-15 neighbors and volunteers participating each week. We hosted weekly Garden Classes for children, alongside the Milo-Grogan Recreation Center. Over 75 lbs of produce was grown and distributed to neighbors. Over 650 volunteer hours and \$3,000 of grant funding sustained the Green Space throughout this past growing season.






Lee's MicroFarm in Milo-Grogan: We are moving in an exciting direction! In 2020, we solidified plans to establish Lee's MicroFarm in Milo-Grogan, in partnership with The Lord Jesus Christ Church, a historical church in the neighborhood, and RootsUp, a local business that builds microfarms. We are raising \$200,000 to build two indoor hydroponic containers, two hoop houses, and a variety of raised beds. Fueled by our desire to address economic disparity and food insecurity in Milo-Grogan, this year-round farm will be sustained through sales to local vendors and a percentage of fresh produce will be donated to Milo-Grogan households each week.
